Hurricane season 2020 officially begins on June 1.

HOW MANY HURRICANES ARE EXPECTED?

Overall, an above-average number of storms is expected in 2020:

- Department of Atmospheric Science at Colorado State University predicts 16 named tropical storms (average is 12.1) of which 8 will become hurricanes (average is 6.4). Of the hurricanes that are expected to occur, 4 will turn into major hurricanes (average is 2.7).
- Similarly, AccuWeather predicts 14 to 18 tropical storms and 7 to 9 hurricanes, of which 2 to 4 will become major hurricanes.

Please make sure you have your personal hurricane plan prepared.
